The Department has reviewed the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) for the above-mentioned project dated August 24, 2007 and the revised attachments dated December 27, 2007. The SWPPP is acceptable to the Department.

Please ensure that the SWPPP is implemented according to all requirements of the SPDES General Permit (GP-02-01) for stormwater discharges from construction activities, including but not limited to the following:

- 1) A copy of the notice of intent (NOI) and NOI acknowledgement letter must be posted at the construction site in a prominent place for public viewing. A copy of the latest version of the SWPPP must be retained at the construction site from the date of initiation of construction activities to the date of final stabilization.
- 2) Contractor Certification Statement must be completed and signed by all contractors and subcontractors implementing, inspecting, and maintaining the measures and controls described in the SWPPP.
- 3) Inspection of Soil Erosion and Sediment Control (SESC) measures must be performed as detailed in the SWPPP and as per the requirements of the SPDES General Permit.
- 4) The SWPPP must be amended if there is significant change in the design or implementation of any SESC or water quality controls which may have a significant

effect on the potential for the discharge of pollutants to the waters of the United States, wetlands, or public streets, and which has not otherwise been addressed in the SWPPP.

Please note that sediment-laden stormwater discharges from the construction activity to Harlem River is a violation of the New York State water quality standards.
